Piano & Math

U of California, Irving found that after six months of piano lessons, preschoolers performed 34% higher on spatial-temporal testing than those who received no training, and those who received computer training.

Private Programs



Private Lesson Program
The Private Lesson Program is offered for 1/2-hour or hour lessons on all instruments for toddlers - adults. Private lessons are essential in developing playing skills, and offers students individualized instruction. Offered for beginning - advanced students.

Dole Program
The Dole Program offers weekly lessons with advanced-level faculty members. All teachers in the Dole Program hold either a Master or Doctorate level degree in Music Performance. Offered for beginning - advanced.

Preparatory Program
The Preparatory Program is designed for beginning level students, ages 5 - 10 years old. Students are required to take hour weekly private lesson and two core classes. Students are required to pass all five levels before being admitted into the Conservatory Program.

Early Childhood Education Program
