



Irish Fiddle

The Irish Fiddle Class at AMI gives students basic fiddling skills while exploring fundamental Irish Fiddle repertoire. Students play as a group and individually, creating a fun and exciting educational experience.

Learning the styles of fiddling music can give violinists an added element to their playing skills. The Irish Fiddle Class is designed for students whom have taken violin lessons for a minimum of one-year. Students do not alter their technique, thus preventing any conflict concerning the classical technique students may be using in private lessons.

Repertoire in the Irish Fiddle class includes traditional songs/pieces such as jigs, polkas, reels, hornpipes, and airs. Students should expect to practice the music from the class in addition to their private lesson/classical repertoire.

The core objectives of the class curriculum include:

- Introduction to fiddle repertoire
- Applying classical technique to fiddle music
- Playing in a group setting
- Exploring alternative styles of violin music
