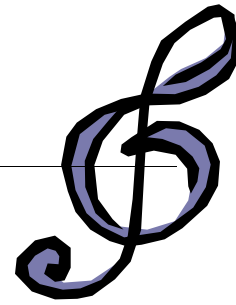


The Musical Parent



The Musical Parent is designed for parents who have children taking lessons or classes in any musical instrument. The class is held in a seminar format, and includes practice tools, idea's on how to encourage routine practice sessions, and basic music theory knowledge. Parents will explore the benefits of music education and the importance it plays in developing cognitive thinking skills. Additionally, the class will survey a variety of means used in constructing a positive and productive learning experience within both the classroom and at-home.

The Musical Parent explores a variety of topics, with a different subject-specific seminar every week. Topics include:

- Making the Most of Your Child's Practice Time
- Fundamental Music Theory for Parents
- Principles of the Suzuki Philosophy and the Importance of the Parent
- The Role of Music Education in Development
- Tools in Learning: Application for both Academic and Musical Study

The class is conducted by an experienced educator, and may have guest speakers throughout the various seminar topics as applicable. Parents will receive practical information throughout the class, and will use a basic music theory book to further develop fundamental musical knowledge. The Musical Parent class is geared towards parents with both a minimal or exceptional amount of musical knowledge — and is open to both AMI and non-AMI parents.
